



"PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)"

I have waited so long in writing this article, and the circumstances at the time of publication have changed so dramatically from the circumstances at the time when I was first asked to write this article. Procrastination, this time, has resulted in an advantage. I have never before heard of COVID- 19. Certainly not before December 2019. It was at the end of Desember 2019 that a worldwide pandemic started. When I noticed, through the international news, that a mortal virus had risen in China at the end of this year, I thought that it would be one of those diseases that in the past had affected epidemically only far away countries, and that this too would come to pass. Life would afterwards continue its ordinary course here where we live.

At the moment, while I was writing this article, there were 45.319.063 cases of infection worldwide, of which 1.186.198 persons have died. In the Dutch Caribbean territory we had 5.605 cases of infection and 41 deaths caused by this virus.

With such high ratings, evidently, we are conscious that although this virus is invisible to the human eye, without the aid of microscopes, this virus is a realistic mortal threat.

In order to protect themselves from this realistic threat, professionals in these medical sectors are using Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). This is the Equipment that they put on to minimize exposure to the danger of harm or serious illnesses at work. The harm from illnesses are caused by contact with chemical, radiological, physical, electronic, or mechanical dangers at work. PPE could include accessories such as gloves, glasses, shoe protection, ear protectors, helms, vests, or a complete outfit.

The Bible clarifies that God hath called us, ministers of the gospel, to open the eyes of mankind "so that they turn their backs to the darkness and accept light, turn away from the power of Satan and accept God". In light of the picture of the great controversy between Satan and God, we are continually exposed to the seen and unseen dangers. Because of this reason,

the apostle Paul addressed explicitly the threat, as well as the PPE that God hath provided so that we would be able to complete our task of ministry.

"10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. 11 Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. 12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. 13 Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. 14 Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, 15 and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. 16 In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. 17 Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.18 And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. 19 Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, 20 for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should."4

God, being a good employer, provided a PPE in the form of a complete outfit for us

The PPE that God hath given us includes a belt of truth around our waist, righteousness as a breastplate, zeal to announce the good message of peace, a shield of faith that can withstand the arrows of fire that the evil ones are inflicting us with. Salvation as a helmet that is able to protect our head and

Spirit.Notice that God did not give us a PPE only to protect us from the enemy, but also to grant us offensive mechanisms so that we can effectively work against the enemies kingdom. This is the 'Word of God which is our sword of the Holy Spirit'.

The Apostle Paul urges us by saying that we ought to 'seek the strength of the Lord and in His great power'. 'Put on the armor that God gives, so you can attack the Devil's deceitful plans'. Paul is conscious that in our own strength it is impossible to confront the threats. Therefore, he urges us to seek power from God, 'put on the armor that God gives', 'persevere', 'stand firm and ready', 'pray and ask God to always help you'.

Therefore, my brethren and companions in the battle, may each of us put on the PPE of God. May we have the discipline to seek power from God each new day. May the grace of God help us to discern well, and to confront false teachings, and that our faith, like a shield, may withstand the evil that men may throw against ourselves, our family members and against our church where we serve. May our waist be girded by the truth so we may bring good leadership into our church in these uncertain times. May the righteousness of God be our protection that covers us and our family members, while we help our congregations to comply with the mission of God in our particular spheres of influence. Finally, may we be effective in our offensive attacks against the reign of the enemy by means of the Word of God which is the sword of the Holy Spirit. So that we may preach the Good News with 'well-mastered courage'. -Maranatha.

- Through Jesus, we are "more than conquerors" (Romans 8:37). "Who can separate us from Christ's love? Trouble, anguish, persecution, hunger, nakedness, danger or threats? Despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us."
- God is trustworthy. God has not abandoned us. He is there, if we have courage enough to seek Him. His ways are not our ways, but we trust that He will fulfill His perfect will in His timing.
- God is in control. Whatever men may do or say, whether it be something good or bad, God knows. Nothing is hidden from our heavenly Father. "Belief God's Word, in the same way that you believe another person. He said it and He will accomplish what He said.... Whatever raises up its ugly head, never be discouraged. The Lord God loves us and He will fulfill His words (1 SM 83 85).

Philippians 4:19." But my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." Remember, there is a God who loves us more than what we can fathom. He knows about your needs and He promises that He will provide. You are not alone during this difficult time. Believe, trust and persevere.

"We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not despairing" (2 Corinthians 4:8).


"These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).

Today more than ever before we do have the opportunity to love and to serve our neighbor, sharing the gospel both with words, but also in action.


While we are going through this new model, it is important to pay attention to what it teaches us, how to deal better with monetary, social, family and spiritual issues.

When we always have what we want at hand (f.e. sports for the kids) it is natural for them to start to take them for granted. We learn that it will always be there and we depend on that. But there's no guarantee. In actual circumstances it is advisable to keep distance, and sometimes we are even told "Stay home!" Be grateful today for all that you have, because some day, maybe, they are gone.

4. Preparation for the future

At the moment our children watch us as grown ups, how we deal with this pandemic and they learn from us for other pandemics that may come in the future. They fix their eyes on our emotions, our vocabulary, and experience. As an adult, how do you want your child to react when it reoccurs in the future? With fear? Prepared? Blaming others? By being agressive? With innovation? With the ability to solve problems? With cooperation? With adaptability? Take time to reflect with them on this posibility and what to do.

5. We will overcome!

We have to go forward, we can't go back. We have to deal with the reality of the circumstances, and don't waste time lamenting and start blaming. But we must be strong in the Lord and be completely sure that God is the One leading us, because He promised that He will not fail us nor forsake us. The way God's promise works requires action and faith from us. If you are in trouble, if you are facing a giant, if you don't have faith and trust in God, it can be very difficult to believe His promise.

That's why, God tells you, do not be afraid, nor dismayed, you will win the battle in My name, you will be victorious, go ahead to war.

Sometimes as a human being you think there is no solution, that God has forsaken you, but I want to tell you that God is still on His throne. And if God is on His throne, why be afraid. If you focus on the problem, be it either sickness, abuse, loneliness or unemployment, you will for sure think that God has forsaken you. Leave them in His hands. Everything is possible for those who belief in God.

May God open our eyes, just like He did for Gehazi, servant of Elisha (2 Kings 6:17).

The Bible presents us in a very peculiar way a parade of characters who, although distant in time, we feel them close, because in their walk through life they show those universal and common features and circumstances to all human beings of all ages, especially to our women of today.

And one of those characteristics is *perseverance* that the Spirit of Prophecy says is:

"active virtue essential to success" (Ev 479)
"Christians can do nothing without" (MH 196)
"must cultivate earnestly" (CG 161)
"developed by inconveniences" (5T 312)
"important in character building" (MYP 45)
"needed to fill responsible calling" (Ed 267)

Here are some women in Bible times who demonstrated this virtue. They are:

ABIGAIL:

A beautiful woman, with a foolish husband. She had probably been wed to Nabal for his wealth. (The Top 100 Women of the Bible, p. 11). When her husband intentionally offended King David's servants (1 Samuel 25:4-13), when she heard about it, without saying anything to her husband, she persevered in doing what was good, and so

saved both her life, that of her family, and that of all the servants.

ACSAH:

Daughter of Caleb, whom the father raffled off to the man who was succesful in battle, courageous enough to attack and capture Kiriath Sepher. Othniel, Caleb's nephew was the man. He became the first major judge of Israel. As part of her dowry, Acsah received dry land in the Negev. So she told her husband to ask Caleb for another field, one that had springs. When Othniel didn't do it, Acsah persevered and took on the task herself and got the land.

ANNA:

A prophetess advanced in years, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. Having lived with a husband seven years after her marriage, and then as a widow to the age of 84, she never left the temple, she dedicated her life to the Lord. She persevered, serving night and day with fastings and prayers. She had the privilege of seeing the Messiah with her own eyes. She immediately recognized Him. She gave thanks to God, and continued to speak of Him to all those who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

DEBORAH:

A prophetess whom God chose and had given authority and a message for Barak whom God chose as the country's military commander to go and fight Sisera, the Canaanite commander. He was reluctant to do it. "If you will go with me, then I will go; but if you will not go with me, I will not go." That was a strange petition for usually only men went to war. But Deborah persevered as a consecrated leader and she went with him with an army of 10.000 men. God Himself fought for them, and they won the batle against the enemy. She described herself as "a mother in Israel."

ESTHER:


A beautiful Jewish girl, married to a pagan king. When the situation arose where she and her

JOCHEBED:

Courageous mother and slave in Egypt. She loved all her children. When the wicked pharaoh said to throw all newborn male babies into the river for them to die, she decided to hide her baby as much as she could, up to 3-months, but then she persevered in seeking another solution to preserve the life of her son. By God's inspiration she made a rush basket and placed it in the Nile River and allowed his sister to hide and watch over him. Miraculously, through the Egypt princess, the life of the baby was spared.









own people would lose their lives, she persevered in doing what was right, and risked her life going unto the king and ask for his help, though she was not summoned to present before him. And she said these famous words: "And if I peresh, I perish!"

HANNAH:

She was married to a devout Israelite, but she was sterile and couldn't give him a child. The husband married a second wife who gave him children. Separate from this second hurt, the new wife tormented Hannah continually with her words, even insinuating that God had cursed her and left her because she could not bear a child. Afflicted in spirit she presented her case to the Lord and persevered in prayer, even promising that she would give her son back to Him to serve Him forever in His temple. And God heard and


He was Moses, chosen by God to deliver the Hebrews from slavery.

"EXAMPLE OF THE PIONEERS"



During the time of the Great Disappointment in 1844, a small group emerged that later on would be known as the Seventh Day Adventists. The following list includes the name of the principal ones:

- James White (1821-1881) writer, preacher, administrator
- Ellen G. White (1827-1915) writer, the Lord's messenger
- Joseph Bates (1792-1872) author, retired ship captain
- Stephen Pierce (1804-1883) Bible student, author
- Hiram Edson (1806-1882) preacher, author
- John N. Andrews (1829-1883) author, preacher, missionary
- E. Cornell (1827-1893) preacher, evangelist
- Stephen Haskell (1833-1922) evangelist, administrator, missionary
- N. Loughborough (1832-1924) evangelist, administrator
- Uriah Smith (1832-1903) editor, administrator, preacher

(Thanks to Adventist Pioneer Library who compiled the biography of many of these pioneers).

These believers, who went through the experiences of these first years, are known as Adventist Pioneers.

The pioneers of the Seventh Day Adventist Church were members of the Seventh Day Adventist church. They were part of the Millerite group that came together after the Great Disappointment that took place in the whole United States of America, and they formed the Seventh Day Adventist Church in 1860. Three years after that, on May 21, 1863, the General Conference of Seventh Day Adventists was established and the movement became an official organisation.



Many of the Adventist pioneers initiated their work when they were teenagers. When the Seventh Day Adventist church was formed, it was teenagers and young adults who carried many of the leadership positions.

BUT THEY PERSEVERED!

Since the start, each one of them, in their own situation, struggled with many hardships. They invested everything they were and had for the Advent Movement. Some of them were timid, afraid to speak in public, but they still did it with the help of God's Holy Spirit.

Poverty was something that Ellen and James White struggled with at the beginning and at other times in their marriage. It is told that the first furniture for their house was either borrowed or bought at a sale. Notwithstanding, it is told that Ellen was a generous and practical Christian. Among other things, when she could afford it, she used to buy whole bolts of fabric, which she kept at hand to sew new clothes for those in need. She would go to auctions and buy second hand furniture to put in storage, so when a house burned down or there was another calamity, she was prepared to help. Even before the days when the church started with its plan of retirement, if she heard that any elderly worker had financial problems, she would send them some money to help them in their emergency.

The pioneers traveled extensely, in all kind of weather, going everywhere they were invited, to carry the Advent message. Sickness and weakness bothered them, nonetheless they persevered in the cause, overburdened sometimes, because the workers were few in all areas of the cause. The health of many broke down. They even had to amputate a leg under the knee from Uriah Smith. But they persevered!

They were persecuted and molested by opposers, clergy of other faith, or by Satan who tried to take away their lives, or to discourage them through the death of their children and other loved ones. They struggled also with opposition inside the cause, and one of the most painful came from a very talented pioneer, called Dr. John H. Kellogg.

EXAMPLE OF THE PIONEERS (6T 419)

"It has cost self-denial, self-sacrifice, indomitable energy, and much prayer, to bring up the various missionary enterprises where they now stand. There is danger that some of those now coming upon the stage of action will rest content to be inefficient, feeling that there is now no need of so great self-denial and diligence, such hard and disagreeable labor, as the leaders in this message experienced; that times have changed; and that since there is now more means in the cause of God, it is not necessary for them to place themselves in such trying circumstances as many were called to meet in the rise of the message.

But were there the same diligence and selfsacrifice manifest at the present stage of the work as at its beginning, we should see a hundred times more than is now accomplished.

If the work is to go forward on the high plane of action upon which it started, there must be no falling off in moral resources. New accessions of moral powers must continually be made. If those now entering the field as laborers feel that they may relax their efforts, that self-denial and strict economy not only of means but of time are not now essential, the work will retrogade. The workers at the present time should have the same degree of piety, energy, and perseverance that the leader had.

"We can do nothing without courage and perseverance" (MH 196).

"Neither young nor old are excusable in trusting to another to have an experience for them... Men, women, and youth, God requires you to possess moral courage, steadiness of purpose, fortitude and perseverance" (2T 130).



"GOD SPEAKING THROUGH MATTHEW 24:13"

"But he who perseveres till the end will be saved" (Beibel); "But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved" (KJV); "But those enduring to the end shall be saved" (NIV); "Staying with it—that's what God requires. Stay with it to the end. You won't be sorry, and you'll be saved" (The Message).

In the first vision E.G. White received from God, she saw His people traveling on a small road leading up to heaven. Some of the people got weary and started to murmur. Soon they took their eyes of Jesus who was guiding them up ahead; they started to look around, deviate from the road, and stumbled into the darkness on either side of the road.

"The proclamation of the Gospel leading up to the age to come would be hampered by wars, persecution, hatred of believers, and loss of faith. Christ begins His discourse with a warning against deception. There seems to be a connection between the falling away of many (v. 10) and the false prophets who mislead many (v. 11). Satan is a subtle adversary who works as an angel of light through false religious teachers (2 Cor. 11:14, 15). Apostasy is also the result of persecution. Tribulation and being hated on account of Christ precede the mention of apostasy (v. 9). Jesus speaks of 'temporary' faith, and says that a falling away often occurs when 'affliction or persecution arises because of the Word' (13:21). Perseverance in faith and in the accompanying results of faith are positive evidence of a genuine Christian profession." (Commentary of NIV Bible version, p. 1242, 1243).

"God has shown me that He gave His people a bitter cup to drink, to purify and cleanse them... They can make it still more bitter by murmuring, complaining, and repining. But those who receive it thus must have another draught, for the first does not have its designated effect upon the heart. And if the second does not effect the work, then they must have another, and another, until it does have its designated effect, or they will be left filthy, impure in heart. I saw that this bitter cup can be sweetened by patience, endurance, and prayer... And God will be honored and glorified. It is no small thing to be a Christian and to be owned and approved of God." (It would be well to read the entire chapter The Trial of Our Faith, in Early Writings, p. 46-48).

"For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without excuse" (Romans 1:20).

Sometimes we think that those who never heard of God; have no means of getting to know Him either. In the above texts apostle Paul says that these people have no excuse, because they have always all the wonders created by God around them. Even the primitive people living in bushes and desert of this world learned and practiced the lessons of nature to stay of good cheer, healthy and save. For example, research has been made and has discovered that there are more than 10 type of ants called: Syrup Ants; Thief Ants; Bulldog Ants; Needle Ants; Floor Ants; Carnivorous Ants; Ball Ants; Ghost Ants; Turtle Ants; Fire Ants; Surgeon Ants; Lazy Ants; Umbrella Ants. We will analize shortly just the four last type of ants mentioned.

Fire Ants:

We know them as Stinging Ants. This ant bites and then stings you with a poison that iches and hurts. If someone stood in the nest of this ant, and was bitten by this ant, and he is somewhat allergic for this poison, it can even cause its death. At the moment that they bite in defense of their colony, a certain chemical liquid/ fume goes into the air, and all the rest of the ants come to help attack. They can become up to a quart million ants.

Just as these ants persevere until they reach their goal, so also the enemy of our souls tries to tempt us and perseveres until he makes us victim of wrath and sin, and we are completely in his grasp (<u>Luke 11:26</u>). Remember Saul and David. And when we feel that the enemy attacks us, *persevere* in prayer and Jesus will free us (<u>Ps. 59:1, 16</u>).

Surgeon Ant:

In the forests of Brazil these ants can tumble down big trees. These ants have a big jaw, that is very sharp. When someone or an indian hurts themselves, their companions clean the wound, and bring a handful of these ants. What they do is they put the two sides of the skin together and let the ants bite the skin until the wound is totally 'sewed' together. Then they remove the body of the ant and leave only the jaw till the wound heals nicely. The friends with perseverance and patience use these surgeon ants to do a job which a professional surgeon would have done with needle and thread. Allow that the same way the missionaries teach these people that Jesus is their Chief Doctor and He loves them, that we also will persevere and remember He came to heal us of our wounds and skars that sin caused humanity (Psalm 147:3).

Lazy Ant: (Teleuto)


I know this is difficult for you to believe me, but yes, there are lazy ants in this world. Though the Bible uses the ant to say to those who are lazy: "Go to the ants, o sluggard, observe her ways and be wise" (Proverbs 6:6).

There are these which I am sure, you don't want to imitate, because they degenerated so much, that they not only are lazy, but they scarcely move. They live with other type of ants, much larger than they are, that if it was in another ant colony we would think they were the boss of the big ants who do everything for them, because they are so tiny and delicate.

You find these ants only in the house of the bigger ants, and they are transported by the guests of the house; who developed a big belly 'pouch' so the small ant would not fall out.

At the beginning these small ants were stronger and healthier, but by being served constantly, and not persevering in their own lives, little by little they started to lose their strength and importance in their own colony. So they came to the end of their own type, and now they are called: Extinguished Ants.

Therefore, persevere! The Bible tells us clearly: "Whatever your hand finds to do, verily, do it with all your might" (Ecclesiastes 9:10). There is strength in the proposed values of Proverbs 30:25.





Umbrella ants:

We do know by nature that ants are hard workers, and that's why King Solomon advised us to opserve the ants. If you just want to tire yourself out a moment, seek an ant colony and see how they work, and think how you would feel to work just like them, inexhaustible, without rest, without recreation, nothing else but work, work, work and work. Would you have liked that?

The Umbrella Ants live in warmer climates of this world. They prepare their own food and store these in tunnels in the trees (Proverbs 6:7, 8). Maybe you wouldn't like it to have the same diet time after time, but for the ants there is nothing more palatable than these kind of mushrooms. And to enjoy these they need the fresh green leaves so they can spend the hot hours of the day in the shadow, and they use them also for the night. These are like umbrellas on their head, that's why they are called Umbrella Ants.

Imagine yourself an ant of ½ cm large and the journey going to the tree is like 7m (21 feet), this means they walk 1.440 times their own body size. Another way to think how far this trip is for the ants: Consider the height of a normal child, of a walk of 1,6 km. Going in only one direction, to go and cut, carry the food back to the nest, and when you arrive, you have to go again, and again, and again, from morning till the evening. Colleague, maybe sometimes you feel discouraged and lazy, and don't want to continue or don't want to do nothing more, just remember these Umbrella Ants and persevere, thankful for your own lot in life.



Marriage of the Ants

The nuptial flight of some ants illustrate the fact that none of them knows when this event takes place. There exists only one period in the life of these ants when they grow wings. Male and female leave the nest flying in the day or night to start a new colony in a different place. They all prepare with anticipation awaiting anxiosly the moment to start the flight, but the worker ants won't let them leave the nest, until the hour strikes for them to leave. Perhaps they await for the time to have certain characteristics or an internal mechanism to indicate the appropriate moment. When the midnight of that time comes, it is like a loud voice announces: Here comes the Bridegroom! Come out to meet Him! (Matthew 25:6).

The doors open and the ants come out by the thousands and by millions. There must exist some misterious mean of communication between the colonies, because from the nest of all colonies in the zone, at the same moment, these ants come out and start their flight.

The book of Revelation tells us that the four angels stand with patience and perseverance, keeping back the winds of the earth for God's people, His church, His bride, so the saints could be ready.

Just as it happened with the working ants, so also the angels and the redeemed await with patience the definite sign to open the doors for the action to start. The action will not start if we are not all prepared, for we understand this passage speaks of the coming of Jesus, and we must have obeyed the mission and are ready at all times, persevering in the study of His Word and in prayer to be able to receive Him and be saved (Matthew 24:13).
